Community focus:

From the 7th June 2023 the New Kent Police Neighbourhood Policing structure will commence. PC Matt Bensted will be responsible for the ward of Littlestour and Ashstone, including Ash, Wingham, Preston, Staple, Stourmouth and Goodnestone.

PC Matt Bensted will also be responsible for the surrounding villages of Eastry, Aylesham and Elvington at this current time.

Crimes of note:

10.05.2023 – Saunders Lane, Ash – Criminal damage to residential property.

The owner of a property currently undergoing restoration and not being lived in was alerted via their CCTV system that two unauthorised persons were on their site. No access was gained to the unoccupied residency, a windowpane had been broken but this damage was not big enough to gain entry. An investigation has taken place, the two unauthorised people were identified. The owner of the property did not wish to support a prosecution.

16.05.2023 – Pudding Lane, Ash – Criminal damage to a vehicle.

A group of four young people walking around Puddling Lane have been throwing stones and gravel at properties. A resident's property was targeted, and damage was done to a light by the residents front gate and a vehicles windscreen. May 2023 – The Street, Goodnestone – Parking issues.

It was reported to Kent Police that on two separate occasions staff members working at the local school have returned to their cars to find them damaged. On one occasion a staff member returned to find their car had a flat tyre. After taking their car to a garage they were advised it looked like the tyre had been purposefully punctured. On a separate occasion a staff member returned to their car rear windscreen smashed in two places, it did not appear to be an accident as there was nothing left around the car to show what caused the damage. Currently there is no further evidence available to support the identification of the person(s) responsible for this damage. Anti-social behaviour and other incidents of note.

May 2023 – Puddling Lane, Ash – Nuisance youths.

There have been several incidents of a group of youths, males and females, causing anti-social behaviour in the vicinity of Puddling Lane leading down towards the fields at this location. Information has been provided to the Police and two of these male youths have been identified. Passing attention will be made in this area and young people seen in this location will be spoken to and their details taken, in light of the recent anti-social behaviour and damage to residents' property.
