

Certificate of Exemption

By signing this **Certificate of Exemption** you are confirming that:

- The authority has been in existence since before 1st April 2014
- In relation to the preceding financial year (2016/17), the external auditor **has not**:
 - issued a public interest report in respect of the authority or any entity connected with it
 - made a statutory recommendation to the authority, relating to the authority or any entity connected with it
 - issued an advisory notice under paragraph 1(1) of Schedule 8 to the Audit and Accountability Act 2014 ("the Act"), and has not withdrawn the notice
 - commenced judicial review proceedings under section 31(1) of the Act
 - made an application under section 28(1) of the Act for a declaration that an item of account is unlawful, and the application has not been withdrawn nor has the court refused to make the declaration
- The court has not declared an item of account unlawful after a person made an appeal under section 28(3) of the Act.

If you are able to confirm that the above statements apply and that the authority neither received gross income, nor incurred gross expenditure, exceeding £25,000, then the Certificate of Exemption can be signed and submitted to the external auditor.

The Annual Internal Audit Report, Annual Governance Statement, Annual Accounting Statements, an analysis of variances and the bank reconciliation plus the information required by Regulation 15 (2), Accounts and Audit Regulations 2015 including the period for the exercise of public rights still need to be fully completed and, along with a copy of this certificate, published on a public website* before 2 July 2018. **By signing this certificate you are also confirming that this will be done.**

Box 2 Precept or Rates and Levies	6,388	13,250	+6,862	+107.42%	Dover District Council paid the 18/19 precept on 29/3/18 - it is usually paid in the next accounting year - i.e. should have been paid post 1/4/18. This has increased Box 2 by £6,862 - the amount of the 18/19 precept.
Box 3 Total other receipts	813	3,596	+3,483	+308.23%	In 2017/18, the council received a VAT refund of £3,129.62. In 2016/17, no VAT refund was received during the accounting year.
Box 4 Staff costs	1,801	901	-900	-49.97%	In 2016/17, the clerk received both instalments of salary during the accounting year. In 2017/18, the second instalment of £900.51 was not paid during this year, but in April 2018.

Box 6 All other payments	4,099	2,984	-1,115	-27.2%	In 2016/17, there was more PC spending as various items were paid for by the community fund. In 17/18, there has been less call for fund spending and so overall spending has decreased.

Explanation for 'high' reserves	Box 7 is more than twice Box 2 because the authority held the following breakdown of reserves at the year end: reserves continue to be high because the PC has not yet spent the entirety of its £15k community fund received in 2015. The fund was supplemented by a £1k one-off donation in 2015-16. Now that VAT has been reclaimed, there was £4,847 remaining in the community fund as at 31/3/18 - this accounts for the high reserves.
